Objectives and Expected Results

To support the recommendation of the WHO EB to the 70th World Health Assembly to adopt a resolution on sepsis that urges member states to develop training for all health professionals on infection prevention and patient safety.

To highlight that Sepsis as a syndromic response to infection and the final common pathway to death from most infectious diseases continues to cause every year more than six million deaths in adults worldwide.



To convey the message that sepsis has a unique and time-critical clinical course which is highly amenable to treatment through early diagnosis and timely clinical management.

Help to understand that to sepsis can often be prevented through appropriate hygiene, access to vaccination programs, to improved sanitation and water availability.

To encourage the WHO Director-General to support Member States as appropriate, to define standards and establish the necessary guidelines, infrastructures, laboratory capacity, strategies and tools for reducing the incidence and mortality from sepsis.
